BENIN - TYA11 near 21,245 KHz from 1800 UTC, 14,275 from 2000 and 28,520 KHz from 2200 UTC. QSL via ON5NT.

CAMPBELL ISLAND - ZL4OY/C, Chris, expects to arrive late this month for a 1-year stay. QSL via ZL1BQD.

CROZET - FB8WG somehow maintains his cool composure while malicious QRM slows his Saturday list operation on 21,280 KHz at 1600 UTC. He is on 14,170 or 21,170 KHz at 1600 almost daily. QSL via F2CL, Georges de Marrez, Santa Severa, 20228 Luri, Corsica Island.

SOMALI - Now to 31 Dec. T5TI plans regular skeds on 21,295 KHz at 1830 UTC on Wednesdays, Saturdays and Sundays - plus random efforts on 10 and 20 - until his work schedule enables a more definite operating pattern. QSL via IOSSW.

THE GAMBIA - 6-30 November. N6BFN/C5 and W6JKV/C5 with BIG 6-meter stacked arrays looking Stateside. Also, C5AES near 28,725 KHz from 1800 UTC. QSL via K4XG.

TOGO - 5V7HL at 14,290-300 KHz on Sun and Wed from 2100 UTC. QSL to his '81 CBA.

ANTARCTICA - From 7 November for a couple of annual tours. VP8ANT (G3CWI) at Rothera Base on Adelaide Island, will be on all bands but emphasizing 40, 80 and 160 meters.

ZONE 23 - Monitor 14,250 KHz from 1500 UTC on Wednesdays and Fridays as UA3DDA brings up the various USSR Zone 23 stations. Check-ins are welcomed.

BOB'S K6SJZ NOW FAMOUS DUMP CAKE

1 can (1 lb. 4oz.) Pineapple
1 can (1 lb. 5 oz.) Cherry Pie filling
1 box cake mix (yellow or white)
1- $\frac{1}{2}$ cubes butter or margarine
 $\frac{1}{2}$ cup nuts, chopped (or more)

Pour pineapple over entire bottom of 13X9X2 inch glass pan. Dump cherry pie filling evenly over this. Spread dry cake mix and completely cover the pie filling. Slice butter and place over top. Re-doing our house has left us very short on time and patience for Ham Radio, but don't worry--we'll be on again very shortly, just as soon as muscles and nerves recover.

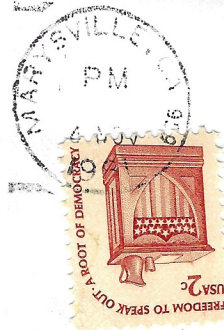
Very happy to hear Harley was up on net the other night--still say hard to keep a good ham down. Good going, Harley and look forward to seeing ya soon!
