HR PROPAGATION FORECAST BULLETIN ARRL HEADQUARTERS, APRIL 5, 1982 - The solar flux average for March was just under 212, the highest since October and the 23rd month over 200 in cycle 21. Late March was also notable for its high level of geomagnetic activity. This carried over into early April, making the past few days mostly poor for high latitude DX on all HF Bands. Somewhat better propagation is expected after April 5, but the sun is moving into a less favorable position for the northern hemisphere and the MUF is falling off on all but transequatorial circuits. We are unlikely to see east west F layer DX on 50 MHZ again until at least next fall, and 28 MHZ openings will be shorter than during the winter months. Though solar activity has held up longer than expected in this cycle, the overall trend is downward and HF DX will be more seasonal than during the past three years. This is plainly apparent in the April QST propagation charts.
