APPLE IMPROMPTU

Prepare:

4 Cups pared, sliced golden delicious apples (4 medium apples).

Place in 8" or 9" pie pan.

Combine:

2 Tablespoons sugar.

1/4 Teaspoon cinnamon.

Sprinkle over apples.

Cover with foil and bake 20 minutes at 400 Degrees.

Cream:

1 Tablespoon margarine.

1/2 Cup sugar.

Add:

1 Egg.

1 Teaspoon vanilla.

1/2 Cup flour.

1/2 Teaspoon baking powder.

Blend into creamed mixture. Spread over the hot apples. Bake 20-25 minutes at 400 Degrees until light brown.

Serve with whipped cream and chopped, toasted almonds if desired.

Serves six.

2. CLUB JACKETS: YSARC HAS BEEN PLANNING ON GETTING SOME JACKETS MADE UP FOR THE CLUB. NOTHING HAS

BEEN DONE ABOUT THIS SO FAR DUE TO A LACK OF INTEREST. THIS SUBJECT WILL BE MENTIONED DURING THE MARCH MEETING TO GET INPUT FROM THE MEMBERS TO SEE IF WE SHOULD PROCEED WITH THE PROJECT.

MORE RAMBLINGS

We recently received the all-mode 2-meter rig that was ordered on December 12, 1989. This thing was made in Japan, of course, so I guess one can expect delays. It does seem, however, that "they" might stock more of their highly-advertised gear on this side of the water.

I've heard it said that we should always buy the equipment that is most often out of stock, since that means it is the most popular. This is supposed to mean that these are the units that are the best available from that manufacturer. Hmmmm--- well, maybe. If this is true, the ICOM 275H must be one fine rig! Anyway, its here now; and it is apparently a good piece of equipment. Time and use will tell.

The ICOM container for the 275H rig has a very interesting notice attached. Printed in both Japanese and English, it admonishes us that these products are strategic products and they shall not be exported without appropriate Government ap-

roval (or something to that effect).

This is most interesting. Does this mean it may not be exported from Japan? Must it stay forever in this country?

All kidding aside, this is the first label of this type I've noticed on a piece of Ham gear. I wonder if this is something new, or if I just have not noticed it in the past. Anyway, I promise not to export the thing, and it will receive the care and protection it so richly deserves.

We spent some time this evening installing the options purchased with the unit. This is quite an experience. There are more cables, plugs, sockets, and such involved in one of these things than one would ever imagine. The design is extremely compact, and everything must fit exactly. Move a cable out of its place, and the thing won't go back together. Each wire and cable must be routed just so, or the darn lid won't go back on!

Of course, some of the add-ons require unplugging sockets and cables. Most of these are tiny and very well anchored. We haven't broken anything yet, but it's still hard on the nerves when the power switch is pushed after the installation session.

I guess the days of "Tune for maximum smoke!" are gone forever. Too bad. Maybe we should write about that some month. You haven't lived until you've seen what happens when a KW push-pull triode amplifier loses its bias pack while you're after that rare one on RTTY.
