Treasures Report:

The Club currently has \$1,523.19 in it's checking account. This includes a VE balance of \$155.15 and a Repeater Donation Balance of \$373.00. Disbursements this month totaled \$454.54 including \$360 in site rental fees.

Old Business:

Field Day

Hugh, N7OKM, reported to the Board that the Rice Festival Site will be extremely hard to get this year but we can plan on it next year by laying the ground work now. Although we could use one of the City Parks in Gridley with no problems there has appeared to be a lack of interest on the part of club members. The Board unanimously voted that the club would not have a Club sponsored Field Day site this year unless a member approached the Board for Club sanction for insurance purposes. Lee, KC6MCI, indicated that he wanted to try and run a high site. Hugh will send off for the paperwork for him.

Sutter Buttes Day

Tom, KB6WID, reported that more HAMS are needed for the Sutter Buttes Day on the 3rd of June. Approximately 4 more Amateurs are needed, HT's are adequate for this event and there is some loaner equipment available. An attempt will be made to gain the participation of the new HAMS in the Sutter area. (See the discussion on membership under New Business)

June Breakfast

The June breakfast will be held on the Second Saturday in June, that is June 10th. The Breakfast will be held in the American Legion Hall in Linda and will be Belgian Waffles.

June Meeting

The topic for the June meeting will be changed from Field Day to Amateur TV operation and equipment.

July meeting/ Swap Meet

The July meeting will possibly be a joint meeting with a swap meet committee from the GEARS Club in Chico. They have responded favorably to our idea of working together to hold 2 swap meets in the Valley area per year. One would be in Chico and the other would be in the Yuba Sutter area. This idea was submitted to the Board by Jim, KE6KMD, and Hugh has been directed to be the point of contact with the GEARS group. Volunteers are needed for this committee.

New Business

Use of Club Banner

Al Robinson, KE6BLK, requested permission to use the club banner as part of his parade entry in Portola. The Board unanimously approved his request.

Donation For the Club

Hugh, N7OKM, reported that his Landlords, Mr. & Mrs. Terry Kite of Gridley, have offered to donate the following items to the club:

1. A 27ft 1969 Condor motorhome. Self contained with a generator and in running condition. This item is valued at at least \$3000.

2. A 16ft fiberglass runabout boat with trailer and 100hp Mercury outboard motor. The Boat and Trailer need some work but the motor is good. The unit is worth at least \$400 due to the motor.

After a discussion the Board decided to accept the donation. It is estimated that the sale of the Boat will cover any DMV and insurance fees acquired by the club. A meeting with the membership will be held to discuss whether or not to convert the Motorhome over to a communications van or to sell it. Hugh reported that the vehicle could be readily converted and would make a good club project. The equipment can be stored, for now in Hughs back yard. Hugh will prepare any necessary paperwork representing the club

Membership and Repeater users

Dave Gartner, WD6AXM, the repeater trustee asked the Board if they had any problems with the recent measures that had been taken to curtail the use of the repeater for those who have not been following the guidelines. The Board indicated unanimous support for the measures and indicated that they felt that the steps should be continued.

A general discussion followed regarding prolonged usage of the repeater by former members of the club and the lack of respect shown, in some quarters for the rights of the Paid Up Club Members

(PUCM). The Board of Directors and Club Officers directed that the following actions be taken.

1. Effective immediately CLUB DUES WILL NO LONGER BE PRORATED FOR FORMER CLUB MEMBERS. After July dues for NEW members will be prorated. New members are the who have not belonged to the club before.

2. A form letter will be created and sent to repeated users of the repeater who are not members of the club or have not supported the repeater and it's expenses. The letter will invite their

membership in the club and or support for the repeaters continued operation as an open repeater.

3. During periods of QRM and or poor operating practices and procedures the repeater may be put into a limited operation mode. The procedures employed will NOT BE DISCUSSED OVER THE AIR OR PACKET BY ANY OF THE OFFICERS OR CONTROL OPERATORS. Operation may be difficult for fringe area members during these periods but is unavoidable. They are invited to apply peer pressure to the offenders whenever they can get an eyeball with them!

Recently the club has seen a decline in the membership coupled with an increase in the usage on the repeater INCLUDING FORMER MEMBERS OF THE CLUB WHO NO LONGER SUPPORT IT OR THE REPEATER. The time has come for those who support the club and the repeater to apply a little PEER pressure to bring the others back into the fold or at least help pay the bills. The Board has come up with some steps that can be taken to apply gentle pressure but the support of the membership is also required. The Board welcomes ideas and suggestions on how WE can improve OUR club. All a member has to do is attend a board meeting and discuss their plan or idea. Are you a member and doer or do you prefer to sit back and let others do the work then complain about the results?

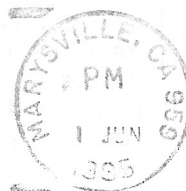
