EDITOR'S RAMBLINGS

The calendar may say otherwise, but Summer has visited the Yuba-Sutter area with a vengeance. The 100 plus degree days last week just about did the old Dad in. I find that as the years roll along, the heat and cold have an increasing effect on me. The last few days have been quite nice, and it is much appreciated.

Yeah, I know, I was supposed to be out of town up under the pine tree. I spent over a week up in the Chester area, where it was cold (not cool), and then went up to Oregon for the long weekend over Memorial Day. In Oregon, one night the low temperature was 29.5 degrees!! We enjoyed the company of our son and daughter and their families. It's always good to have the grand kids along, as they are a constant joy. One grand daughter was sporting a cast on her right forearm, from a minor broken arm (If there is such a thing as a "minor" broken arm!). The cast should come off tomorrow, June 5, if all goes well. Mother can't wait to get rid of it. Two camping trips and all the things kids do while playing, and the heat combine to make it a rather odiferous situation.

We had the HF gear along at Chester, but didn't make any contacts that trip. We did maintain almost constant contact with home via the 147.105 repeater near Willows. That machine has good coverage over the north valley, and while not strong, it covers most of the area west of Chester where the trailer was parked. We were able as usual to check into the 146.085 machine easily from "Radio Hill" near camp.

We took no radio gear along to Oregon except the mobile rig in the pickup. The 146.085 repeater was heard well north of Shasta Lake, though it was very weak until about the Redding area on the way home. We did not attempt to work any of the 7-area repeaters.

Future plans this summer include more time west of Chester, and there should be at least a 40-meter dipole up at the camp location. That will make possible daily check-ins to the Noon time Net on 7268.5 KHz. There is always someone who can copy a portable or mobile station on the frequency. This is a good thing to keep in mind if you do any traveling or camping in the Western states. The people on that net are very capable, and always eager to help where needed.

Some of the club members are talking Field Day this month. If you are interested, get hold of Paul, N6XVL. So often the short-notice events are the most fun. Think about it if you're in the area on June 23 and 24.

Please note that the VE Sessions in July and September have been moved to later dates than the usual first Saturday of the month. Hopefully, that will coincide with your Editor's wandering and allow me to be in town when they take place. In July, it's July 21; and the September date is September 15.

It appears that we will need a stand-in Editor for late June for the July newsletter, and for late August for the September newsletter. Your Editor will be out of town or out of state those dates.
