MORE CA QSO PARTY RESULTS

Tom (W6EO) operated again this year in CQP from his farm in southern Sutter Co. about 5 miles northwest of Robbins. It lies along the banks of the Sacramento River. He and his friend, N6EM operated together using his friends call. They believe that they have the highest score for Sutter Co. this year as they did last year when we used his call, W6EO.

Tom and his friend made a total of 211 CW QSO's and 333 SSB QSO's for a total of 544. They had 54 multipliers – i.e. they worked 54 of the U.S. states and Canadian provinces.

They ran 100 watts and for antennas used a R7000 vertical on 75 SSB and 20 meters and a Force 12 C3 beam on 20, 15 and 10 meters. They did not operate on 40 meters during the contest.

LOVE RIDE

Clip-clop, clip-clop, clip-clop "control, team 1, "Go ahead." The Lake Oroville Vista Endurance Ride (LOVER), a 50 mile and 30 mile horse ride around beautiful Lake Oroville is in progress. Hams from the Yuba-Sutter ARC and The Sweep Riders of the Sierras (SOS) provided support for this annual event.

The Sweep Riders of the Sierras is a unique organization of amateur radio operators who are also horse enthusiasts. They have combined their two loves into one exciting hobby. For the past 4 years SOS has provided communications for this event, with the assistance of Ralph Lucas (W6RWL), Burton Gilbert (N6UG) and Bill Pryor (KD6RSA). This year they invited the Yuba Sutter ARC (YS ARC) to join them. Paul (N6XVL) recruited the volunteers from the YS ARC.

The YS ARC repeater was used for communicating between the various stations along with a simplex frequency at 147.555 between net control, finish line and ride secretary. In addition a portable cross band repeater was set up by Ralph Lucas (W6RWL) to cover dead spots that the YS ARC repeater could not reach. Last year a horse went down in that area and the sweeps could not get out to call for help.

The hams from both the SOS and YSARC that participated were Curtis (KF6VFP) and Burton Gilbert (N6UG) as net control, Paul (N6XVL) in Mobile 1, Mike (W6CUJ) and

Steve Dawson (KG6BOR) at Lunch stop, Marvin (KE6JNT) and Virgil Toothaker (KG6FW) at Spillway, Tom (KD6WID) and Ralph Lucas (W6RWL) at Ride Secretary, Donna Gonsalves (KF6UOQ) and Sue Jessen (KG6IZM) as Sweep Team 1, Stuart Porter (KG6GVD) and Gail Maduri as Sweep Team 2, Linda Zeigler (KG6IMS), Liz Helms (KF6SYV) and Dawn Simas as Sweep Team 3, Bob Balthrope (KD6WTY) and Maty Pope (KG6EOV) at finish, and Randy Hackbarth (KD6MIW) at Private Property. Bill Pryor (KD6SRA) was the event director's; Kathy Papa (KG6IBI); shadow. Finally Mary Anne Balthrope (KE6EST) oversaw all the ham efforts. In all there were 20 ham operators and 2 non hams (sweep riders) used along with 100 volunteers and veterinarians to cover the entire 50 mile course. We were on the air from 5:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. Over 100 horseback riders were tracked by number and time. When the last horse came over the finish line, every single one had been accounted for.

We were lucky this year with no rain on event day, in spite of the showers on Friday. We were also lucky by not having any casualties and limited injuries. In the past there has been lost riders and downed horses.

Thanks to all the regular users of the repeater for standing by during the entire 14 hours and to Dave Gartner (WD6AXM) for the use of the repeater.

ARES NEWS

Ham radio to the rescue! Once again, amateur radio operators in the Yuba-Sutter region helped out in an emergency. This time it was an exercise. November 13th saw an area wide disaster response drill with swat teams, fire and law-enforcement personnel, local government emergency services, and a group of volunteer amateur radio operators helping out with back up communications. It was the Emergency Medical Support Agency's (EMSA) California exercise, and ham radio was there.

Michael Colvin, of Maryville, callsign W6CUJ, was called to Yuba County Emergency Operation Center and began assigning volunteer communicators to other places where they were sure to be needed. Ron Murdock, W6KJ, of Yuba City, established

station at Three Rivers Red Cross, coordinating simulated Red Cross support with Mike Scott, Red Cross Director of Disaster Services. Curtis Sylvester-Jose, KF6VFP, went to Rideout Hospital, to set up a portable radio station there, and later drove to Colusa to handle emergency radio communications at the Sheriff's Office and Emergency Operations Center. He later relayed a report which Ron Murdock in turn relayed to Redding. Additionally, Michael Hardesty, KG6PNG, of Marysville, assisted Yuba County Social Services with backup communications. In an actual emergency, many more local ham operators would have been involved, as happened with the floods of 1986 and 1997.

VETERAN'S DAY PARADE

Seven local hams marshaled and directed the start of units in the Veteran's Day Parade in Marysville on November 11. Five of them were themselves veterans.

Paul (N6XVL) operated under the tactical call of "Honcho" and shadowed the parade director. Ron (W6KJ), Mike (W6CUJ), Jerry (N6LAI) and Curtis (KF6VFP) used tactical call signs of "Marshall 1" through "Marshall 4." They help the various parade participants to find their holding places while they waited for their turn to march. They then started them out in the correct lineup. Herb (W6HBU) was "Control" and directed all traffic. Finally Tom (KB6WID) operated as "Review" and passed on to the announcers any changes in the program such as an incorrect spelling of names and missing participants and the status of the parades progress.

The group operated on the simplex frequency of 147.450 from 9:00 a.m. until the parades end at 12:00 P.M. Thanks to Paul for organizing all the volunteers.
