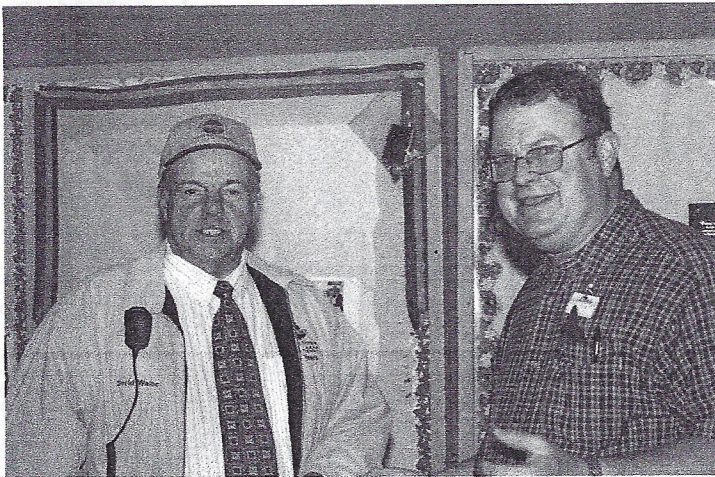

idea of making the biscuits and honey come out even should strike a chord.

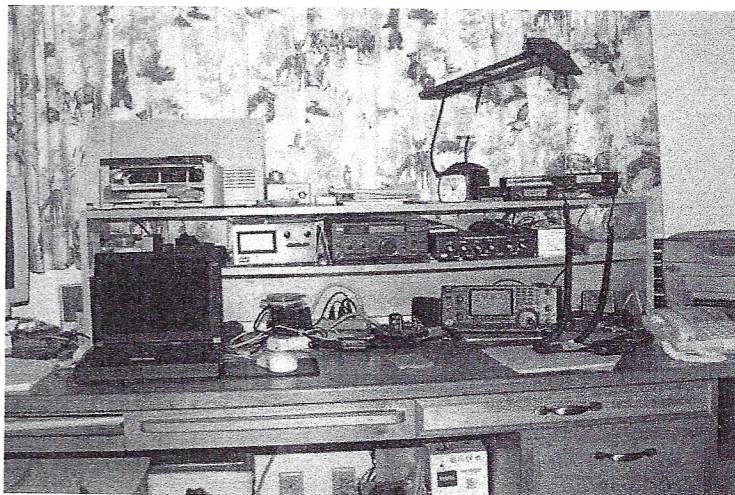

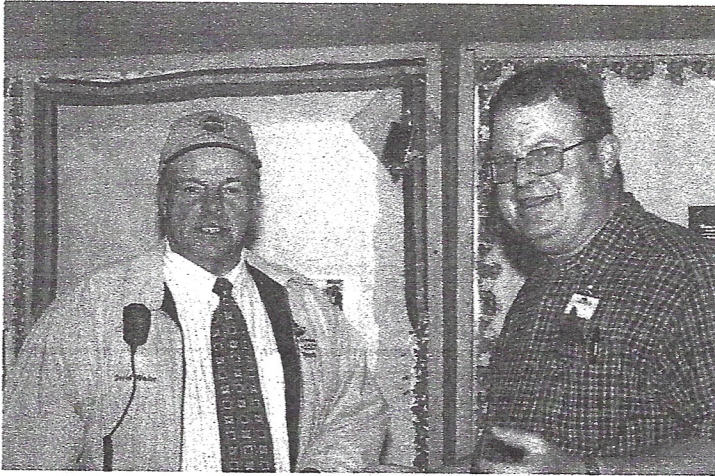

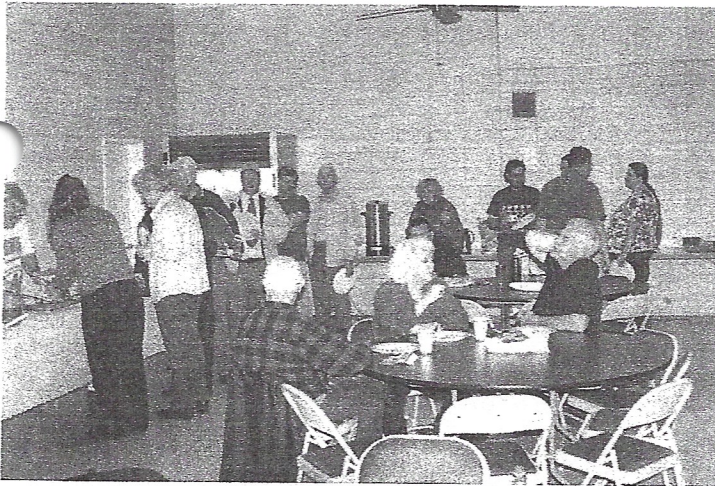
