Minutes of the April Board Meeting were approved after being corrected. Corrections were:

Presidents Message

Next month will see use of the new Technician question pool. I would encourage all of you to go to the ARRL.org web site and review the new question pool. Some will complain about the "dumbing down" of the questions but I think the Question Pool Committee is getting real with what entry level exam questions should cover and how the vocabulary should phrased.

Having read the new questions, answers, and foils and comparing them with the old, it is clear that the emphasis has shifted from theoretical to practical. No longer do the questions cover every authorized activity authorized by the Technician license to those activities most likely to be used by a new ham. For example, there are no more questions about EME (Earth Moon Earth). Now what new ham would consider starting out with EME? Maybe a radio astronomer would, but that leaves out most others. On the plus side for the new questions is the inclusion of questions about Echolink and IRLP, two popular internet repeater-linking networks that many a new ham is likely to use.

The phrasing of the questions has been simplified.

Gordon West, the well known ham radio teacher and winner of this year's Dayton Ham of the Year, helped to rewrite the questions in easier to understand English. Fred Maia, W5YI was involved in proposing new questions too. Here is an example of an old question: "What is the minimum safe distance for a controlled RF radiation environment for a station using a 17-element Yagi on a five-wave length boom on 144 Mhz at 100 watts as specified in Figure T0-2?" Tough to understand the old style of question isn't it? Many potential licensees would just give up before even trying to pick the correct answer.

A clearer way to ask a similar question from the new pool is: "What factors affect the RF exposure of people near an amateur transmitter?" Also, good news is the reduction from 59 questions on RF exposure to only 11 possible question, from which only one will be on the Tech test. I always thought these questions seemed endless and confusing to new hams.

The criteria for the new pool included goals of keeping questions on a high school reading level, and eliminating those dealing with obsolete technology and adding questions relating to digital communications, APRS, repeater linking and satellite communications. A "Special Operations" section now includes questions on operating away from home, hidden transmitter hunts, contesting, and special events stations. These reflect activities a new ham is likely to do rather than try Moon Bounce. Of note, all of the diagrams, tables and component symbols have been eliminated in favor of direct questions and direct answers.

Finally, the whole format of the pool has been reorganized with the addition of three new sections on "station setup and operation," "emergency and public service operations" and "radio waves and propagation," while reducing the number of questions from 511 to 396. Again, check them out for free at the ARRL.org web site under exams. I welcome the new changes, and I hope you will too. Let me hear from you. Reminder: This Saturday June 11th at Country Waffle at 10 AM we have reserved a place for a Club



A view of the Field Day Site area


MORE INFORMATION ON FIELD DAY

EDITOR'S RAMBLINGS

CQP WEEKEND WAS LIKE ANY OTHER, except, there we were, three hams atop Oregon Peak, Myself, KI6COJ Steve, and N6LAI Jerry. We set-up for the day, dug in, masts up, dipoles strung, coax connected, powered-up and transceivers dialed-in. Things went together extraordinarily well. We were a curiosity to the CDF folks in the lookout tower. They just kind of looked at us, looked at the equipment, the shrugged and went about their routines. I don't think they could appreciate the whole perfect-match-zen-ham-DX-electron-RF-nirvana-tropo-e-on a clear day-in the woods state of mind that we were experiencing. We made some initial contacts on 2m and 6m, mostly local, and admittedly the world of 50Mhz and above was sadly quiet. W6HBU's loaner IC-746 was poised, and listening and worked outward into 20 over 9 reports from stations contacted on 6m and 2m, but the quantity of hams just wasn't on VHF. Just as I was about to kick the dirt and relent, all of a sudden, our HF window opened, almost explosively on 10m and 40m. At around 11AM DX stations from as far as Eastern Europe (Hungary) and hundreds throughout the continental U.S. began to pile-up. There we were, on that hill and talking en-masse to the rest of the U.S. and beyond. I was particularly impressed with Steve's lil pistol FT-110 and the 100w linear on the dipole, the primary HF rig. Big ears, and
